

# Residential Withdrawal Management Service (RWMS) Admission COVID-19 Point of Care (POC) Testing for Clients – Medical Directive

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## **Authorizing Prescriber(s)**

Addictions Medicine Physician(s)

#### Authorized to Whom

Nurses working in Residential Withdrawal Management Service (RWMS) who have the knowledge, skill, judgement, and appropriate training to perform a COVID-19 Point of Care (POC) Test

## **Patient Description/Population**

Any client, aged 16 years or older, with planned admission to RWMS and/or clients who are being tested at RWMS for admission to Women's Residential Treatment Program (WRTP)

### **Order and/or Procedure**

These orders are not presented in sequential order; any one of or combination of the procedures may be performed by the nurse

# Indications to the Implementation of the Directive

The authorized implementer will:

- Collect COVID-19 test swab the day of the planned admission
- Run COVID-19 POC test as per device instructions as well as training received through LH
- Enter the COVID-19 test and result into the electronic system
- Run COVID-19 quality control tests as per device instruction as well as training received through LH

# Indications to the Implementation of the Directive

Any client, aged 16 years or older, requiring admission to RWMS and/or WRTP

# **Contraindications to the Implementation of the Directive**

This medical directive must not be implemented in the following circumstances:

- Client or Substitute Decision Maker (SDM) refuses to consent to the procedure(s)
- Client is less that 16 years old

Document Sponsor/Owner Group: (Mental Health and Pinewood, Date Approved 16AUG2021)

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**Medical Advisory Committee Approved: 20AUG2021** 

Client has facial anomaly or facial trauma that interferes with swabbing

### Consent

- The nurse implementing this medical directive must obtain consent
- If the client/SDM refuses to consent, or is unable to provide consent, contact the authorizing prescriber to determine the plan of care

### **Documentation Requirements**

In addition to standard documentation practices, the nurse implementing this medical directive must document the following in the order section of the client's health record:

- The procedure performed on the client
- The name of the medical directive
- The name of the implementer
- Legible signature of implementer, including credentials (unless documenting electronically)
- Date and time (unless documenting electronically)

#### **Review/Evaluation Process**

Mental Health Program Council will review this document every two years

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
