RE: ROC CCC update

We have received notification from ROC, that effective May 1st, 2014, we remain in the Continuous Compressions Arm (CCC) of the trial! Therefore, no change in your cardiac arrest management will occur for the next six months.

I will take this opportunity to reinforce the ROC benchmarks and the good things you are already doing for our patients:

- The approach to the patient in cardiac arrest is same regardless of cause:
 - Initiate chest compressions
 - Place the defibrillation pads and analyze the rhythm as soon as possible and then as prompted every 2 minutes after that.
 - Compressions, once started, should not to be interrupted for ventilations, but must be paused only for a rhythm analysis.
 - When a shock is indicated, provide compressions during the defibrillator charge cycle.
