Finding a Family Doctor or Nurse Practitioner

It can be hard to find a family doctor or nurse practitioner in the area where you live. This handout offers information that may help you find a new family doctor or nurse practitioner.

1. Health Care Connect

Health Care Connect is a government program that can help you find a family doctor if you do not have one. To sign up, call 1-800-445-1822. Go to hcc3.hcc.moh.gov.on.ca

2. Community Health Centres

Community Health Centres have programs to help you and your family stay healthy. These programs are free. Ask if their doctors or nurse practitioners are taking new patients.

3. Your local newspaper

Some doctors advertise in the local newspaper when they are taking new patients. These doctors may be new to the area or taking on another doctor's practice.
