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Program Overview

Lakeridge Health offers a range of mental health and addictions services in Durham Region and Scarborough from several locations, by over 300 staff and physicians.

We work in collaboration with many partner organizations, social services, education and justice/policing to provide access to services across a continuum of programs.

Child, Youth and Family Program

Services for children and youth aged 5-18 Oshawa Hospital 905.576.8711 ext. 34345 Outpatient services require family physician referral.

Youth Crisis Intervention Team (YCIT)

Support for children and youth experiencing a psychiatric emergency is available through the Youth Crisis Intervention Team in the Oshawa Emergency Department. Inpatient admission is arranged by a psychiatrist.

Intensive Ambulatory Program (IAP) - Day Hospital Program

Short term assessment and stabilization day program for adolescents whose mental health is preventing them from attending school or functioning well in the community.

Outpatient Therapy

Psychiatric assessment and medication monitoring, psychological and occupational therapy assessments and individual, family and group therapy. Therapy addresses mood disorders, anxiety disorders, suicidal ideation and self-harm, trauma and sensory integration dysfunction.

Child and Adolescent Inpatient Program (CAIP)

CAIP is an eight bed secure unit for children and youth requiring hospital admission due to a psychiatric emergency, such as, suicidal/homicidal thoughts, hallucinations, delusions or bizarre behavior. The inpatient unit is a short term assessment and stabilization unit.

A voluntary, client-centered, mental health program delivered by an interdisciplinary team in the community. It is designed for people with severe and persistent mental health illnesses, with the primary goal of individualized recovery through community treatment, support and rehabilitation services. A key feature of ACTT is 24/7 access to services. Referrals can be made by individuals, families, doctors or other health professionals.

The Inpatient Program embraces the Recovery Model of Care in providing assessment, stabilization and treatment for those experiencing severe episodes of mental illness or situational crisis.

Admission is accepted through a psychiatrist. Treatment is provided by an Interdisciplinary Team and emphasizes psychiatric and psychosocial stabilization.

Mental Health Day Treatment Program

Day Hospital consists of a three week, daily group program designed to improve function, provide structure and decrease isolation.

The 12-week Day Treatment program runs two to three days per week and provides support and coping strategies using a client-centred, recovery model of treatment. The team of registered nurses, a social worker and a recreation therapist work with the referring psychiatrist to assist clients in attaining their goals.

Assessment and group treatment for adults 18 and older who have experienced impaired function related to depression and anxiety.

Services include intensive group therapy provided by an interdisciplinary team. Treatment focuses on stress and symptom management, healthy relationships and effective communication. Family education is also offered to family members of registered clients.

Young adult services are available to help transition youth to adult services.

Treatment for adults with complex depression, anxiety and trauma related disorders. Time-limited psychoeducation, treatment, and psychotherapy to adults over age 18. Services include a variety of treatment options, including structured psychoeducation groups, group therapies that draw on evidence based concepts from Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT), Dialectical Behaviour Therapy (DBT) and/or transdiagnostic and skills-based approaches. Referrals are accepted from the Crisis Intervention Team, Inpatient Unit, Psychiatry or the Mental Health Day Treatment Program, community physicians and psychia-trists.

Sexual assault and domestic violence counselling is provided for individuals 16 years of age and over. Referrals are accepted from the Emergency Department, the Crisis Intervention Team or the community.

An interdisciplinary team provides assessment and comprehensive treatment in collaboration with the family, school and community to optimize recovery.

An interdisciplinary team provides outpatient assessment and treatment of eating disorders for youth and adults. Treatment includes group and individual psychotherapy, nutrition counselling, family therapy, carer support and physical health monitoring.

Women's Residential Treatment Program

A 21-day residential program for women over the age of 18, with a day treatment option. The program accepts referrals from residents across the province of Ontario.

Services are intended for women with significant substance use concerns and provides an intensive, structured treatment program. Treatment is based on a biopsychosocial model that is woman-centred and trauma-informed, focusing on first stage trauma treatment. Treatment is group based, with weekly individual counselling sessions.

Rapid Access Addiction Medicine Clinic (RAAM)

The RAAM clinic provides a walk-in treatment service for clients needing immediate help with alcohol, opioids and other substances, and who are not currently connected with addiction counselling services. Services provide quick access to care for addiction issues, including assessment, counselling, connecting clients to community-based mental health and addiction services as well as prescriptions for medications that may help with lessening cravings and withdrawal symptoms. The clinic is staffed by Addiction Counsellors, Nurse Practitioners and Medical Doctors. No referral or appointment is required.
