FLUORESCEIN ANGIOGRAPHY

Fluorescein Angiography is a dye study which shows the areas of bleeding in your eye to be seen. Before this study, the nurse will dilate your pupils with drops. The dye will be injected by the nurse through a small needle, placed in the back of your hand.

INSTRUCTIONS

1. You may eat and drink before this treatment.
2. Please bring sunglasses – your eyes will be sensitive to light.
3. Please bring a complete list of your current medications.
4. Have someone drive you to the hospital. Please limit your driver/escort to one person due to limited space.
5. Report to Lakeridge Health Bowmanville, Surgical Registration Office 1st Floor, Room N101 (If you come in through the main entrance, you need to go up one floor).
 - Parking:
 - Eye Centre Entrance – Queen Street
 - Hospital Main Entrance – Prince Street

After the Fluorescein Angiography You May Have:

1. Yellow skin for 12 hours.
2. Dark yellow urine for 12 hours.
3. Nausea occasionally.
4. Bruising, and slight discomfort at injection site.
