Supporting COVID-19 patients through recovery

Our critical care teams have successfully extubated - or removed the breathing tubes from - more than 10 patients on ventilators to help them breathe. This means that patients are regaining their lung function and are on the road to recovery. This is wonderful news for patients, families and our teams.

Helping Fight COVID-19 in the Community and Long-Term Care Homes

Lakeridge Health is using our expertise and resources to support long-term care (LTC) and retirement homes to stem the virus and care for vulnerable members of our community.

Lakeridge Health, along with many community partners, is supporting LTC and retirement homes through large-scale testing of residents and staff, providing expert support in infection control, and providing residents with care and medical services using virtual technology.

Starting this week, Durham Region residents who have a probable or confirmed case of COVID-19 and are discharged home will have access to critical health care services to support their recovery. The *Virtual Ward* allows a team of home care nurses and Lakeridge Health physicians to monitor and support patients through an online app on each patient's mobile device.
